



Letter from the CEO

Across the social impact sector, leaders are operating in an environment defined by uncertainty and growing community need. Nonprofits and social enterprises are being asked to respond to deeper, more complex challenges with fewer resources and limited room for experimentation. Too often, organizations are left to navigate these pressures alone, without the strategic capacity, flexible capital, or trusted partners needed to adapt and grow.


SVP Denver exists for moments like this. In 2025, our community supported dozens of social ventures through skills-based consulting, training cohorts, and impact investments, while engaging hundreds of Partners, funders, and community members in action-oriented philanthropy.

As I stepped into the role of CEO in late 2025, I did so with deep appreciation for the strong foundation this community has built and the steadiness our Partners, staff, and supporters demonstrated throughout the year. The challenges ahead are real, but SVP Denver is uniquely positioned to meet this moment by strengthening organizations and mobilizing a community committed to local impact. By the Numbers

In 2025, SVP Denver Partners and trainers advised 40 social ventures through 23 pro bono projects, cohort programs, and solution sessions—nearly 6x growth in projects from 2024. We launched a Fundraising Accelerator in partnership with the BIPOC Nonprofit Development Center and piloted new workshops. More than 450+ Partners, social ventures, and community members participated in workshops, events, and the Impact Showcase—a 50% increase from the prior year. We also invested \$131,000 in six social ventures through impact investments and microgrants, launched the Colorado Impact Investment Network (COIN), and reestablished the Collective Impact Fund. Throughout the year, we brought community together to build relationships, spark collaboration, and create moments to celebrate progress and reflect on our shared impact.


